First and foremost, a big THANK YOU to all the members for their support, physically and financially.

We aerated the greens last month, and then mother nature decided winter was still part of the plan. Weekend temps after aeration dropped into the teens. It sure is hard to grow anything when it is that cold. The greens have made a drastic improvement in the last ten days and will only get better as the weather becomes more conducive for recovery. With a little extra shot of nitrogen, the greens should be fully healed by the 3-person scramble on the 15th.

We will begin mowing more areas as the course starts to wake up from winter dormancy. Greens are being mowed daily. Tees and collars with zoysia on them are waking up first and we will keep a close eye on them. We are still a few weeks out on mowing the bermuda fairways, but I bet it will be here before you know it.
